# **GSRA 2014 Election, Legislative and Policy Update**

As part of its advocacy and education role, GSRA actively follows elections for State of Georgia government, and this election year is no exception. GSRA is monitoring elections of significant interest to our membership, including the 2014 gubernatorial election. GSRA is also cranking up its efforts related to the upcoming 2015 session of the General Assembly.

It all starts with the theme of our Annual Meeting (*Decision 2014 – Electing Georgia's Leaders*), that includes a presentation from the candidates for Governor on Tuesday, October 7.

- All three candidates have been invited and given broad topics we want to see covered by them. Governor Nathan Deal and Senator Jason Carter have accepted and will be with us on Tuesday. Our invitation letter included the topics as follows:
  - Funding for ERS and TRS to include "cost of living" adjustments for ERS members,
  - Including formal input of plan members into State Health Benefit Plan design and related costs,
  - Hiring and retention of State Employees for the improvement of state services, and

- Potential tax reform impact on state revenues, various population groups, businesses and economic growth.
- Prior to the Annual Meeting, we will send the candidates more detailed questions—jointly written with education associations—to let the candidates know that retirees in our state stand united as one in common efforts and that all of us expect answers to these questions.
- When the detailed questions are given in advance of the meeting, we'll summarize and include in the postmeeting newsletter so that GSRA members and all other interested groups and individuals will see what each candidate has to say in depth to our queries.

The involvement of the entire membership of this association is vital to getting our concerns considered and addressed by state decision makers – both the Governor and the members of the General Assembly. We're moving boldly to refine and strengthen our efforts at both the grassroots and Atlanta levels. High visibility and contact by our members, such as participation in the Annual Meeting and GSRA Day at the Capitol, is critical to supporting these efforts.

GSRA is continuing its policy of working with partner organizations where we have common interests. We had great success at the last legislative session working jointly with members of education-related groups, especially the Professional Association of Georgia Educators (PAGE), as well as our friends in the Georgia Professional Human Services Association, and Georgia Retired Educators Association. By strengthening our relationships with these organizations, we present a unified voice to legislative committees and leadership at the Capitol.

For example, we worked for legislation affecting both active and retired state employees and educators in the 2014 legislative session. The bill formalized an advisory process that would have included representation on the Board of Community Health and created an advisory council to improve transparency and lead to better decisions regarding State Health Benefit Plan benefits. We were jointly visible at committee meetings, and in the offices of legislators and almost reached a portion of our goal., We also learned some valuable lessons at the 2014 session: (1) the need to strengthen our grass-roots training at the Local Chapter level in "the do's and don'ts of legislative contact work," and (2) the need for full-time representation on behalf of the association at the Capitol during sessions and in legislative interim periods. These lessons led us to conclude that we need a legislative liaison function to keep us posted on what is going on and to call us to make our voices heard at key moments in the legislative process. If this is not done, we leave the work of monitoring, reporting and training solely to retiree volunteers who, honestly, have just so much energy and time to devote to this task.

We will keep you apprised of activities in both these areas, but meanwhile, continue to support your GSRA in its efforts to serve you in the political arena – we *all know what happens if we don't get and stay active!*

#### Is there a catch?

No, there is no catch. AMBA and GSRA entered into a contractual arrangement for AMBA to provide these services. Periodically, GSRA will provide AMBA with the names and addresses of the members so that AMBA can send you information. You are not subjected to unwanted solicitation or subject to further release of your contact information. When you receive information from AMBA on behalf of GSRA or receive a call and you are not interested in receiving benefit information, you can call AMBA and ask AMBA to discontinue letting you know about your GSRA benefit program. Governor Deal and Senator Carter will each appear separately during the Candidate's Forum on October 7<sup>th</sup>, Tuesday afternoon, and respond to the same set of questions submitted to them previously by GSRA and partner education organizations.

# SHBP Financial Report for FY 2014

GSRA requested and received the Department of Community Health's financial reports for the State Health Benefit Plan for FY 2014. Additional analysis will be provided in a later newsletter; however, one can conclude that: (1) average member premiums were increased in 2014 although by transferring all members to the "bronze" option for CY 2014, those members who remained in the "bronze" option paid a lesser premium than in CY 2013; (2) claim payments were substantially reduced again for FY 2014 following a substantial decrease in FY 2013 also; (3) premium payments (contact rates), which are primarily for the Medicare Advantage Plan, are substantially increased in FY 2014 partially as a result of a greater number of retirees attaining age 65; (4) administrative expense is substantially increased. FY 2012, FY 2013, and FY 2014 amounts supplied by DCH are compared below.

#### **Membership Dues Deduction – ERS**

GSRA is working with the Employees Retirement System to implement deductions for the GSRA membership fee – that is \$1.67 per month—from the retirement benefit for those individuals who "sign-up" for deductions. In the next couple of months, we will send you a form and explain in more detail the process for "signing-up" and having the amount deducted from your retirement benefit. Because of the administrative cost of handling the deduction, ERS has asked us to "sign-up" about 1,200 members for deductions. The process will help you and GSRA. It will save you the hassle of receiving multiple emails (statements) about renewal and a postage stamp if you mail your check. It will also save GSRA administrative expense on postage and staff time for sending statements, opening returned mailed and depositing checks. We expect the ERS deductions will be available by the end of 2014 – but we'll give you more information later.


#### **Volunteers Requested**
