

#### 2009-2010 GENERAL ASSEMBLY - BILLS OF INTEREST Updated through February 4, 2010

The Georgia General Assembly convened the 2010 session on January 11, 2010 with all members concerned about the impending FY 2010 and FY 2011 revenue shortfall. February 4<sup>th</sup> was the 12<sup>th</sup> of 40 legislative days.

The following table provides information on bills of interest that have been introduced in the first 12 days of the Session plus the bills have are held over from the 2009 General Assembly Session. Legislative bills that have been introduced in the 2010 Session are listed in the first section in numerical order. Holdover legislation is listed in the "2009 Introduced Legislation" section.
