

#### 2009 GENERAL ASSEMBLY - BILLS OF INTEREST Updated through March 5, 2009

The Georgia General Assembly convened the 2009 session on January 11, 2009 with all members concerned about the impending FY 2009 and FY 2010 budget crisis. Because of the continuing decline in State revenues and the passage of President Obama's Stimulus bill (The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act), the General Assembly adopted a resolution to convene for 3 days each week until March 25<sup>th</sup> and then reconvene on Monday, June 22<sup>nd</sup> for the final 5 legislative days. That Resolution has been superseded by HR 565 that provides for the General Assembly to convene on March 9, 10, 12, 17, 18, 19, 20, 23, 25, 26, and 30, April 1 and to adjourn on April 3—the 40<sup>th</sup> legislative day.

The following table provides information on bills of interest that has been introduced through March 5th in the 2009 General Assembly Session. Changes and updates since February 26, 2009, are highlighted in red.

SB 3	Requires the Commissioner of Insurance to oversee the operation of pharmacy benefits managers (PBM), including the ones used by the State Health Benefit Plan (SHBP). The response to a request for prior authorization must be completed within 24 hours, steptherapy must be used for medications excluded from the preferred drug list, and a physician must be reimbursed when prior approvals exceed 10 in a 30-day period, at the rate of \$10 per approval. SB 122	Amends the Code to separate the Georgia Retiree Health Benefit Fund into two separate funds—the Georgia State Retiree Health Benefit Fund and the Georgia School Retiree Health Benefit Fund. The bill provides for local school systems to be liable for the post-employment costs for teachers and school personnel retirees, and for state agencies (subject to appropriations) to be liable for the post-employment costs for state retirees. SB 129 and HB 249	Amends Public Retirement Systems Investment Authority Law to allow retirement funds to be placed in "alternative investments". Applies to large retirement systems, including the Employees Retirement System (ERS), but not the Teachers Retirement System (TRS).  See GSRA's Feb. 13 Action Alert!
