

2009 GENERAL ASSEMBLY - BILLS OF INTEREST Updated through March 20, 2009

The Georgia General Assembly convened the 2009 session on January 11, 2009 with all members concerned about the impending FY 2009 and FY 2010 budget crisis. House Resolution 565 provides for the General Assembly to convene on 23, 25, 26, and 30, April 1 and to adjourn on April 3—the 40th legislative day.

The following table provides information on bills of interest that has been introduced through March 20th in the 2009 General Assembly Session. Changes and updates since March 13th, are highlighted in red.
