

2009 GENERAL ASSEMBLY - BILLS OF INTEREST Updated through April 4, 2009

The Georgia General Assembly convened the 2009 session on January 11, 2009 with all members concerned about the impending FY 2009 and FY 2010 budget crisis. House Resolution 565 provides for the General Assembly to convene on March 30, April 1 and to adjourn on April 3—the 40th legislative day.

The following table provides information on bills of interest that has been introduced through March 20th in the 2009 General Assembly Session. Changes and updates since March 27th, are highlighted in red.

SB 3	Requires the Commissioner of Insurance to oversee the operation of pharmacy benefits managers (PBM), including the ones used by the State Health Benefit Plan (SHBP). The response to a request for prior authorization must be completed within 24 hours, steptherapy must be used for medications excluded from the preferred drug list, and a physician must be reimbursed when prior approvals exceed 10 in a 30-day period, at the rate of \$10 per approval.
