Georgia's Pension Systems Continue in Acceptable Funded Ranges

The Boards of the Employees Retirement System and the Teachers Retirement System met on April 20, 2017 and May 17, 2017, respectively. Of importance on each Board's agenda was a review and discussion of the actuarial reports as of June 30, 2016, and the facts that impacted changes. The reports also show demographic and financial information for FY 2016 and in some cases historical data also.

The ERS report shows a funded percentage at the end of FY 2016 of 74.7% an increase of .6%; the TRS report shows a funded percentage at the end of FY 2016 of 74.3 a decrease of 4.8%. The primary reasons for the changes are the low investment returns, increase in number of retirees resulting in lower active to retiree number, and a change (TRS) in the interest rate smoothing for actuarially valuing assets. The changes resulted in funded percentages in the ADEC¹ employer contribution rate for ERS of 24.66% (down from 24.69%) and for TRS 20.90% (from 16.81%).

Although the number of state employees decreased from 60,416 in 2015 to 59,766 in 2016 and the number of teachers increased from 213,990 in 2015 to 218,193


in 2016, the average active salary increased from \$38,945 to \$39,895 for state employees and from \$48,354 to \$49,420 for teachers. Reports showing the numbers of active personnel with less than 5 years of service show substantial turnover in both ERS and TRS pension systems.


Charts A and B compare the Actuarial Assets and Liabilities, Unfunded Actuarial Assets Liability and Funded Ratios for the Employees Retirement System and the Teachers Retirement for the last five years (2012 through 2016). The good news is that the ERS funded percentage increased – albeit only .6% in 2016 -- but an increase. Unfortunately, the funded ratio for the TRS dropped from 79.1% in 2015 to 74.3% in 2016.²

Both systems experienced investment returns of 1.4% during 2016. In calculating systems' liabilities, the ERS retained its smoothing investment return for future years – in accordance with the Board's Funding policy. However, the TRS changed its smoothing investment return from 7.5% to 7.0% for future years, resulting in a greater unfunded liability.

Based upon the Unfunded Actuarial Accrued Liabilities, the ERS employer contribution (ADEC) for FY 2019 is set at 24.66% (down from 24.69%) of active employee

salaries, and the TRS employer contribution (ADEC) for FY 2019 is set at 20.90% (up from 16.81%) of active teachers salaries.



Kip's View: A Positive Meeting

On Wednesday, May 10, 2017, Steve Herndon, GSRA President-Elect, Stan Jones of Nelson-Mullins, our Legislative Liaison, and I met with Mr. Lonice

Barrett, Chairman of the ERS Retirement Board, and Ms. Teresa MacCartney, Chief Financial Officer and Director of the Governor's Office of Planning and Budget. The meeting was to express GSRA's support of efforts to improve the funded liability of the ERS Retirement fund. It is our hope that the Governor in his 2018 Budget will include funds for another immediate increase to retiree benefits to continue efforts to help retirees keep up with inflationary increases and potential loss of purchasing power, and some additional contribution to the ERS retirement fund to help buy down the unfunded liability at a faster rate than the current 25-year buy-down rate.

Combined, these two suggested remedies will provide a continued short-term and long-term solution to the ERS Retirement Fund issues.

While the meeting yielded no firm commitment to address this problem, there was a positive discussion of the issues facing the upcoming budget, and a willingness to consider our request. It was also noted by Ms. MacCartney and Chairman Barrett that they appreciated the manner in which this subject has been approached and the cooperative approach that GSRA has taken in the matter. Both have committed to attend our Annual Meeting in Columbus, Georgia to continue this dialogue. We look forward to seeing them and you at our Annual Meeting in October in Columbus, Georgia on October 16th and 17th!
